



Sciennes Primary School Football Club

Members' & Coaches' Handbook

This document is a reference guide to Sciennes Primary School Football Club (SPSFC), aka "Sciennes FC"), providing information about how the Club operates, Codes of Conduct, contact information and other guidance.

Members of the Executive Committee will endeavour to keep the contents up to date. Feedback and suggestions for improvement are welcome and can be addressed to any member of the Executive Committee.

Topics are captured in alphabetical order and an index is provided at the end in case of difficulty locating what you are looking for.

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About the Club

Sciennes Primary School Football Club operates as a 'sub-group' of the Parent Council and has its own Constitution and governance. The Club is not run by the School, as Football is not part of the School's curriculum. To that end, our Club is independently run from the School and City of Edinburgh Council.

The Club aims to allow boys and girls who attend the school to play and enjoy football with others of a similar age. As well as having fun and learning football skills, the Club emphasizes good sportsmanship, teamwork and fair play.

The Club is open to P2-P7 year groups, with P1s invited to try out the Club after the Easter break.

The Club is run by and relies upon parent volunteers: to get involved, parents do not need prior coaching experience and can contact a member of the Executive Committee, or a current coach to find out more.

Annual General Meeting (AGM)

The Club's AGM is held annually in May or June each year. For more details of what is covered, refer to the Constitution. Members of the Club, as defined in the Constitution, are invited to the AGM and are entitled to put themselves forward for election to Club Committee or Executive Committee positions, and to vote on matters raised at the AGM.

The Secretary is responsible for communications about the AGM, arranging the venue (typically a room in the school) at the date agreed by the Executive Committee and inviting the Members to attend. It is normal practice to also invite the Chair of the Parent Council and School's Head Teacher /Deputy Teacher as observers, though neither of these parties is entitled to vote at the AGM.

The AGM in 2023 was held 21st June 2023.

Breakages & Broken Equipment

Care must be taken to look after Club equipment and return it after use. However, things can get accidentally damaged in use or may naturally wear out.

Any broken items must be reported to the Club buyer (<u>merchandise@sciennesfc.co.uk</u>) or Chairperson (<u>chairperson@sciennesfc.co.uk</u>), who will arrange for repair or replacement and recycling as appropriate.

Childcare

The Club does not offer a child-minding service. It is required that each child will have a parent or other responsible adult in attendance during training sessions and matches.

Club Accounts

The Club accounts are managed by the Treasurer. They are independently examined (by the Parent Council Treasurer) and they are signed off annually by the Chairperson before being submitted to the Parent Council Treasurer.

Coaching

All year groups are coached by the parents and or carers of children in those groups. Without them the Club would not function. Parents of new P2 groups are very much encouraged to get involved, and are given initial assistance by other more experienced coaches. No great knowledge of the game is expected or required.

Coaches can also participate in SFA coaching classes aimed specifically at coaching of children. These classes run regularly at various venues throughout the region and the costs of coaching are paid for by the club. They are a fun way to improve coaching skills and are suited to everyone interested in helping to coach. *(See Coaching Qualifications.)*

Coaching groups also have access to the Club's Dropbox account, which has information about the running of the club; player and coaches' registers and provides areas for each year group to store training plans and other useful information.

Sciennes parents/carers volunteering as coaches are actively encouraged to take advantage of the opportunities to improve their coaching provided by the Scottish Football Association (SFA). The SFA offers a structured pathway for coaching children of primary age. (See right.)



Codes of Conduct

Sciennes Primary School Football Club fully supports the codes of conduct as introduced by the Scottish Football Association. The Club has Codes of Conduct for Coaches, Parents and Players.

These should be provided to parents each year following registration and sent to all new coaches.

COACHES' CODE OF CONDUCT

- Allow all players, no matter their level of ability, the opportunity to play.
- Respect the rights, dignity & worth of every player and treat everyone equally within the context of football.
- Always pursue fair play.
- Place safety and well-being of the player above the development of performance.
- Be aware of the SFA's and the Club's Child & Vulnerable Adult Protection Policy and Procedures.
- Ensure that coaching sessions are enjoyable, well-structured and focus on developing skills, decision making and a general understanding of the game.
- Develop an appropriate working relationship with players based on mutual trust and respect.
- Encourage players to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and performance.
- Ensure that sessions and games are appropriate for the age, maturity, experience and ability of the individual.
- Must consistently display high standards of appearance and behaviour.

PLAYERS' CODE OF CONDUCT

- Play by the rules the rules of your club and the laws of the game.
- Never argue with a referee or other official [coach] without these people you can't play football.
- Control your temper verbal abuse of officials and abusing other players doesn't help you enjoy or win any games.
- Be a team player It's a team game, treat it that way.
- Treat all players as you would like to be treated fairly.
- Co-operate with your coach, the referees and team-mates.
- Play for your own enjoyment & to improve your skills.
- Don't use ugly remarks based on race, religion, gender or ability you'll let down your coach, team-mates and family if you do and many such comments are actually illegal.
- Remember, you are representing your school.

PARENTS CODE OF CONDUCT

- Remember that you are there for the participants to enjoy the game.
- Encourage participation but don't force it.
- Teach that enjoyment is more important than winning.
- Never ridicule mistakes or losses supporters are there to support not downgrade.
- Lead by example and respect all players, coaches, referees and spectators physical or verbal abuse will not be tolerated.
- Recognise all volunteers who are giving up their valuable time.
- Never publicly criticise referees raise personal concerns with club officials in private.
- Don't use ugly remarks based on race, religion, gender or ability you'll let down your family and yourself if you do and many such comments are actually illegal.

Discretionary Spend

Each group has a standard discretionary spend of £100 per year with an additional £5 for each player in excess of 20. P7 and P6/7's year groups have double the total discretionary spend (i.e. £200 with an additional £10 for each player in excess of 20).

The discretionary spend is of course discretionary and it is up to the coaching group how it is spent provided it is used to the benefit of the children in the Club.

EPSSA

EPSSA is the Edinburgh Primary Schools Sports Association (a Council body) that organises football activities (among other sports) for primary aged children in the P4/5 and P6/7 age groups.

Typically the call to sign up and pay the membership fee for the year comes out in October each year and there is a deadline by which payment must be received. The communication goes to the school. (In 2016, the deadline for signing up for the season was Wednesday 2nd November 2016.

EPSSA Girls' Football League

The EPSSA girls' football league runs from around September to April and comprises fixtures for P4/5 and P6/7 teams. This is currently organised by Bill Stobie with entry forms generally sent to school head teachers to be completed and returned late August or early September. If the entry form has not been received by 1st September, it would be worth chasing up!

Etiquette Around School on Training & Match Days

Access to the Club's kit room is via Millerfield Place and the back of the school. As Millerfield Place is a residential area, coaches and parents alike are requested to take care when moving equipment back and forth from the kit room to avoid parked cars and to respect private property.

Please also observe the following:

- Don't leave a car parked in the turning area near to the school gates
- Don't park in permit holders' spaces during restricted times
- Don't clean boots and leave the mud on the pavements
- Keep noise levels down

Executive Committee

Position	Typical responsibilities
Chairperson	Ensuring the Club is run in accordance with the Constitution; coordinating Club communications in concert with the Secretary; creating the Club newsletter; administering Facebook & Dropbox, maintaining this Handbook; handling escalated matters. Website management and content updates.
Secretary	Working with the school's Child Protection Officer to manage PVGs; making preparations for Committee meetings and AGMs; preparing minutes; communicating to affected groups with regard to competitions and trials; supporting other Club communications.
Treasurer	Managing the Club accounts; monitoring Spending Plan; setting up registrations forms (jotforms); managing registration receipts.
Merchandise (Buyer)	Handling purchases of equipment for the Club including footballs, training equipment, end of year awards; coordinating arrangements with the Club kit shop at The Football Nation; supporting arrangements for professional coaching and winter lets. Managing equipment repair and replacement.

Expenditure

Funds raised by the Club from registrations and other means are used to provide equipment used by the teams, to improve the facilities we have (e.g. the kit room) and to pay for venues for the winter months. In a typical year we may need to cover the costs of:

- New footballs for training and matches
- o Goals and spares
- \circ $\;$ Other training kit such as kit bags, bibs, cones etc.
- Winter lets for 9 teams for up to 12 weeks
- Professional coaching support from for younger age groups
- End of year medals and P7 awards

Expenditure is planned and managed through the annual Spending Plan.

Fundraising

The Club raises money in the following ways:

- Annual Registrations (maintained at £30 for the season 2023-2024) this is by far the main source of funding
- Summer and Winter School Fairs a small sum is made from kit sales and games at the school fairs
- Individual year groups can raise additional funds to supplement their discretionary spend via bake sales or other activities

Girls' Football Tournaments



Injuries

Primary responsibility for the duty of care resides with the parent or carer of the player or their nominated representative. Coaches should have up to date emergency contact details for the players in their group.

Nevertheless, in case of injury, notify a First Aider if assistance is required.

Inspector's Cup

The Inspectors Cup competition takes place annually, usually in the last Saturday of April at Wardie Playing Fields at 9.30am. It is open to P7's.

Insurance

The Club is insured as a sub-group of the Parent Council as stated in the Parent Council Constitution. The City of Edinburgh Council pays for our insurance, and it is currently provided through SPTC (The Scottish Parent Teacher Council).

Issues & Concerns

Any disputes arising during sessions or matches can hopefully be resolved amicably by those involved. The Committee and Executive Committee is available to assist with such difficulties where required. The Chairperson and Secretary can be contacted in such cases.

The Club will deal with issues that arise as follows.

If an issue arises that a parent, coach or Member wishes to bring to the attention of the Club, in the first instance this should be brought to the attention of the Year Group Representative, who will try to address and resolve the issue there and then.

If the issue is not or cannot be satisfactorily addressed by the Year Group Representative, the issue can be escalated by the person who raised the issue or by the Year Group Representative to the Chairperson, who will try to address and resolve the issue.

If the issue is not or cannot be satisfactorily addressed by the Chairperson, the Chairperson can escalate to the issue to the Parent Council or Sciennes Head Teacher as appropriate.

It is recommended that Year Group Representatives (or others if an issue is escalated) listen calmly and sympathetically to issues raised, and seek to respond fairly and in a reasonable time with their proposed resolution to the person raising the issue. The Club does not have a formal complaints procedure other than what is written here but for serious or major complaints, it is recommended that Year Group Representatives and other Committee Members keep emails and other records of what is discussed so these could be referred to if necessary.

As a sub-group of the Parent Council, if required, the Club could with the assistance of the Parent Council leverage the complaints procedure of the Parent Council, which is captured in the Parent Council Constitution. Membership Fees

Membership fees are currently £30per year¹, free to those on income support. Fees should be paid using ParentPay, which is the Club's preferred option because the tool provides helpful reports the Club can readily use to produce team lists, generate mailing lists etc., avoiding the need to re-key information. The fee is a one-time payment and remains the same price for each player registration throughout the school year whenever they join during the school year. <u>https://www.sciennesfc.co.uk/join</u>

If in exceptional cases this method of registration is not possible, payment can be made by cheque accompanied by the completion of a paper registration form (available on request from the Secretary). Cheques should be made payable to "Sciennes Primary School Football Club" and routed to the Club's treasurer.

Sciennes has been able to put forward up to 4 players for the P6 Scottish FA 2020 Development Centre Trials. The numbers allowed are related to the size of the school. Emails inviting application to the trials are sent to the school late August and usually need to be returned within 1-2 weeks.

The trial process aims to select the most talented players in the city at this age group. Those selected will be invited to participate at the exciting Scottish FA 2020 football centre on a weeklybasis. According to the organisers, the standard of the trial is always very high and only the schools most talented players should be sent along. Applications using the official forms should be returned to <u>soccersevens@ea.edin.sch.uk</u>.

The trials are open to both boys and girls.

Parent Council

Professional Coaching

From time to time the Club may secure professional coaching for a number of training sessions to supplement the coaching provided by parents in the Club. For the P2-P4 age groups Grey and Gold has been piloted in the 2017-18 season. Contact <u>merchandise@sciennesfc.co.uk</u> for more details.

Purpose and Aims of the Club

The club aims to allow boys and girls who attend the school to play and enjoy football with others of a similar age. As well as having fun and learning football skills, the Club emphasises good sportsmanship, teamwork and fair play.

Further details of the objects of the Club can be found in the Club Constitution.

PVGs

All coaches are required to complete the Disclosure Scotland PVG process.

Standard PVG (Protecting Vulnerable Groups) application forms are provided to the Club by the school's Parent Council PVG coordinator, who administers this process on behalf of the Parent Council; and circulated to those requiring one by the Club Secretary. The Club aims to keep a supply of forms available.

People who are already registered with PVG through work or another club or institution should ask for an "Affiliate member" form instead.

On the standard form, parts A – C should be completed as appropriate. In Part A put x against 'Scheme Record'. If the individual has a professional registration body e.g. teaching/ medic/ nursing/ social work, please ask the Secretary, as Morven has a list of codes for this section.

Parent Council PVG representative needs to see each form with 3 pieces of ID (1 photographic) to confirm identity and address. She is then required to complete a coversheet and send the forms to CRBS who investigate each one on behalf of Disclosure Scotland.

It is recommended to the Executive Committee to arrange for Parent Council PVG representative to come to football on a Saturday morning to expedite matters at the start of a new season and/or at other times as may be necessary.

Schoolboard Cup

The School Board Cup competition is a competition for P6 (& under), which in 2017 took place starting on Saturday 6th May 2017 at Wardie Playing Fields at 9.30am. Details are circulated each year to the Sciennes Head Teacher and forwarded on to the Club Secretary. Further information can be found on Dropbox under FAQs.

Season Duration and Training Frequency

The Club begins each year in August, usually on the second Saturday after the return to school, and ends on the last Saturday before the final week of the Summer Term. Training (or matches) take place each Saturday, with the teams decanting to indoor or all weather facilities in the winter months (December to February).

SFA Performance School

The SFA Performance School, run in partnership with the City of Edinburgh Council at Broughton High School is a programme aimed at talented boy and girl footballers who are currently in P7 entering S1 (in August 2017).

An auto email is then generated upon completion of the application offering trial dates and times. For children who play for a school and/or recreational team the closing date in 2017 was Wednesday 1st February 2017 and for children who had already signed for a pro club the closing date was Wednesday 15th February 2017.

The website gives an idea of the standard expected for joining the Performance School.

Soccer Sevens

Organised competition for football year groups for teams that are P4, P5, P4/P5 mixed, P6, P7 or P6/P7 mixed. Organised by the Soccer Sevens Coordinator, information is provided by the school and should be forwarded to the Club Secretary for dissemination. The Club Secretary should be prepared to check that entry details have been received if these are not forthcoming. The registration process for the Soccer Sevens August 2016 – June 2017, closed Friday 27 May 2016. Verification and all details were due to be confirmed by Wednesday 22 June 2016.

Soccer Sevens Festivals

Annual series of inter school matches held on consecutive Saturdays in June. Contact the Soccer Sevens Coordinator for details.

Soccer Stars P4/P5 SFA Programme

This was a new programme run by the Scottish FA for P4/P5 girls and for those slightly younger with a real talent for football. (It was first announced May 2016.) It was described as open to all standards and represents the introductory step on the performance pathway which leads to Development Centre, Sports Academy, Regional and National squad selection.

Spending Plan

An annual spending plan is proposed by the Executive Committee and presented by the Treasurer for approval of the Parent Council.

Start of Season Tasks

The following tasks should be performed in preparation for the start of a new season:

- July/August: Reminder to coaches about the official season start date (as agreed at preceding AGM)
- Early August: Secretary/Chairperson arranges for the registrations system to be set up on ParentPay via the School
- Early August: Secretary/Chairperson arranges for the registrations system to be set up for p1 tasters (currently through jotforms).
- August-September: Collect names, contact phone numbers and email addresses of coaches and update the Coaches' Register on Dropbox accordingly.
- August-September: For all coaches who have direct contact with players, obtain their names, whether or not they have any SFA or other coaching qualifications, and whether or not they have and first aid qualifications and follow up with the PVG Coordinator to ensure those individuals secure a valid PVG disclosure if they don't already have one.
- August-December: Coaches chase up registrations for children attending the Club but not yet registered.

Summer Fair

The Club runs an outdoor stall at the Summer Fair to raise awareness of the club.

Typically the stall could include:

- Joining information and early registrations
- Boot Exchange / Recycling
- Lost Property
- Kit recycling
- Fundraising Games
- Disposal of old footballs
- Beat the goalie

Training

Training takes place on Saturday mornings, when our allocated space on the Meadows is available to the Club. Start time is left to individual groups to decide (typically not sooner than 9am and not later than 10:30am). The duration of training is a minimum of 1 hour.

There is precedent for training to run up to 1.5 hours.

Trials

There are a number of different trials for children aspiring to take their football further beyond Sciennes.

Typically, the School receives and passes on information about trials for P6 and P7 trials at the end of August each year. Entries need to be submitted usually within around 1 week of the email we receive – check carefully.

The number of entries Sciennes has (typically 4) is based on the number of pupils in the school. (Smaller schools receive fewer.)

Selecting who will be put forward is a tricky business. From past experience we do not do make a formal assessment or trial within the club, but instead allow the coaches for the particular year group to pick who in their opinion are the best players and put them forward. The decision should be based on mental, physical, tactical and technical abilities. Also it is recommended simply to inform the parents/ carers of the players who are selected and not to broadcast to the whole club.

Training Taster Sessions for P1s

Introductory training sessions are used to introduce P1s to the Club shortly before the end term in preparation for them joining in P2. Currently, these training sessions are run from the second Saturday after Easter (TBC). It was decided in 2019-2020 season that P1s will not be charged a joining fee to attend training taster sessions, to help encourage P1s to join fully for p2 onwards. https://www.sciennesfc.co.uk/join

Until the 2016-17 season P1s were invited only to 1-2 two weekends in June, usually following the Summer Fair in the school, but this arrangement was reviewed (December 2016) and the extended arrangement successfully piloted.

The Club has not opened to P1s from the outset for a number of reasons, principally logistical ones:

Lack of coaches: Introducing new coaches for P2s is a perennial challenge but at least there Version 4.0, December 2023
Page 27 are parents with familiarity with the school at that stage; Getting P1 started would be a greater burden and PVG'd coaches would need to step down from other year groups to get things started

- Space on the Meadows: At the start of the season, there are fewer matches and most teams playing/training at 'home'.
- Lack of space in the kit room for more teams' kit

Winter Fair

The Club runs an indoor/outdoor stall at the Winter Fair to raise awareness of the club and sign up P1s for training taster sessions in the summer.

Winter Lets Facilities





Winter Lets Etiquette

The following should be communicated by year group coaches to their year groups when using indoor facilities:

- Remind the children of additional hazards when playing indoor (i.e. don't run into a wall at full pace or trip over benches etc.!)
- Request that the children do not tamper with any fire exits
- Ensure that children are only accompanied to toilets by a disclosed parent
- No food to be consumed on the premises
- Water bottles should be sealed and care taken to avoid spillages (but if there are then please mop it up)
- All left belongings and litter should be removed by the coaches prior to leaving the school
- Non marking shoes should be worn in the halls
- Ensure you end your session on time, as there may be a group after you needing time to set up their session
- Ensure that you take and return any equipment you require from the club kit room
- Report any damage immediately to the janitor and the Club committee
